

He will sit on the throne of His glory. All the nations will be gathered before Him”



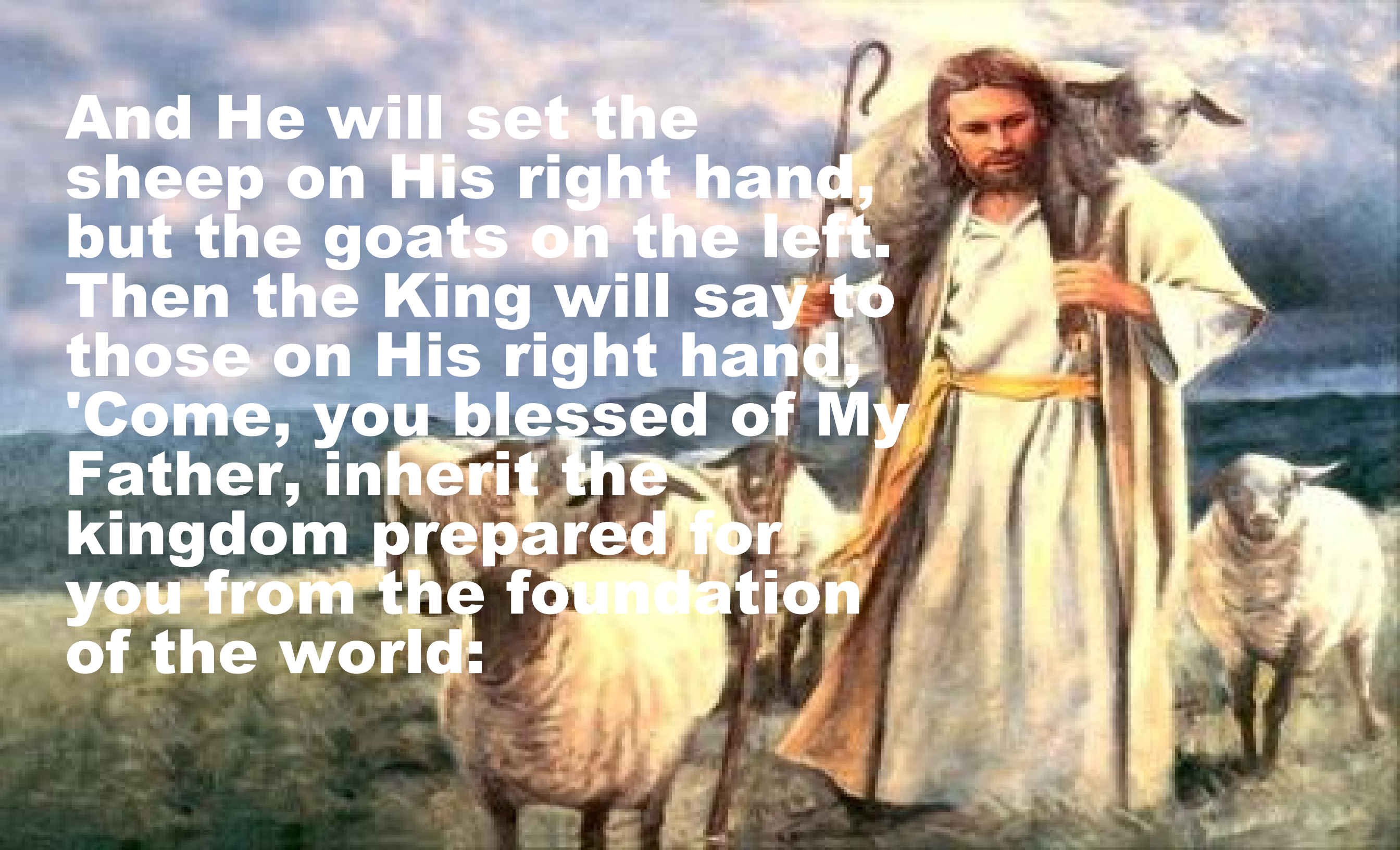
“He will separate them one from another, as a shepherd divides his sheep from the goats”



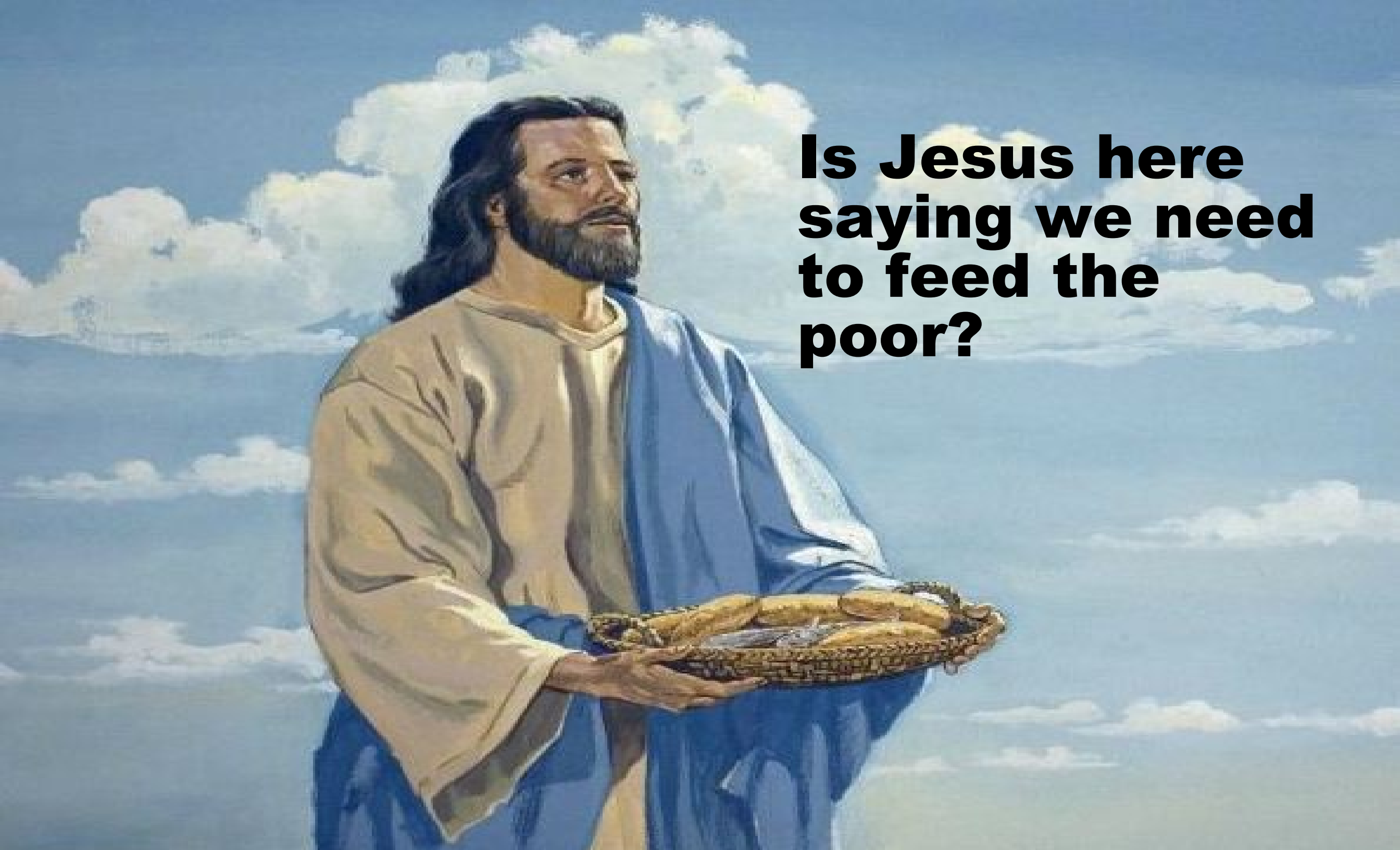



Jesus did feed the poor, through a miracle, twice....out of 12,775 days....“compassion” in the Gospels or in real life refer to none other but Jesus’ compassion – for the crowd (Matt 9:36, 14:14, 15:32, Mark 6:34, 8:2), two blind men (Matt 20:34), a leper (Mark 1:40), a demon-possessed man (Mark 9:17), and a widow (Luke 7:12). Jesus’ compassion for the multitudes is noteworthy. Twice he fed a crowd because He had compassion on them. He taught and fed the 5,000 because they were like sheep without a shepherd (Mark 6:34). He fed the 4,000 because the crowd that was with him for three days had nothing to eat, and He did not want to send them away hungry, or they will collapse on the way, because some of them have come a long distance (Mark 8:2).

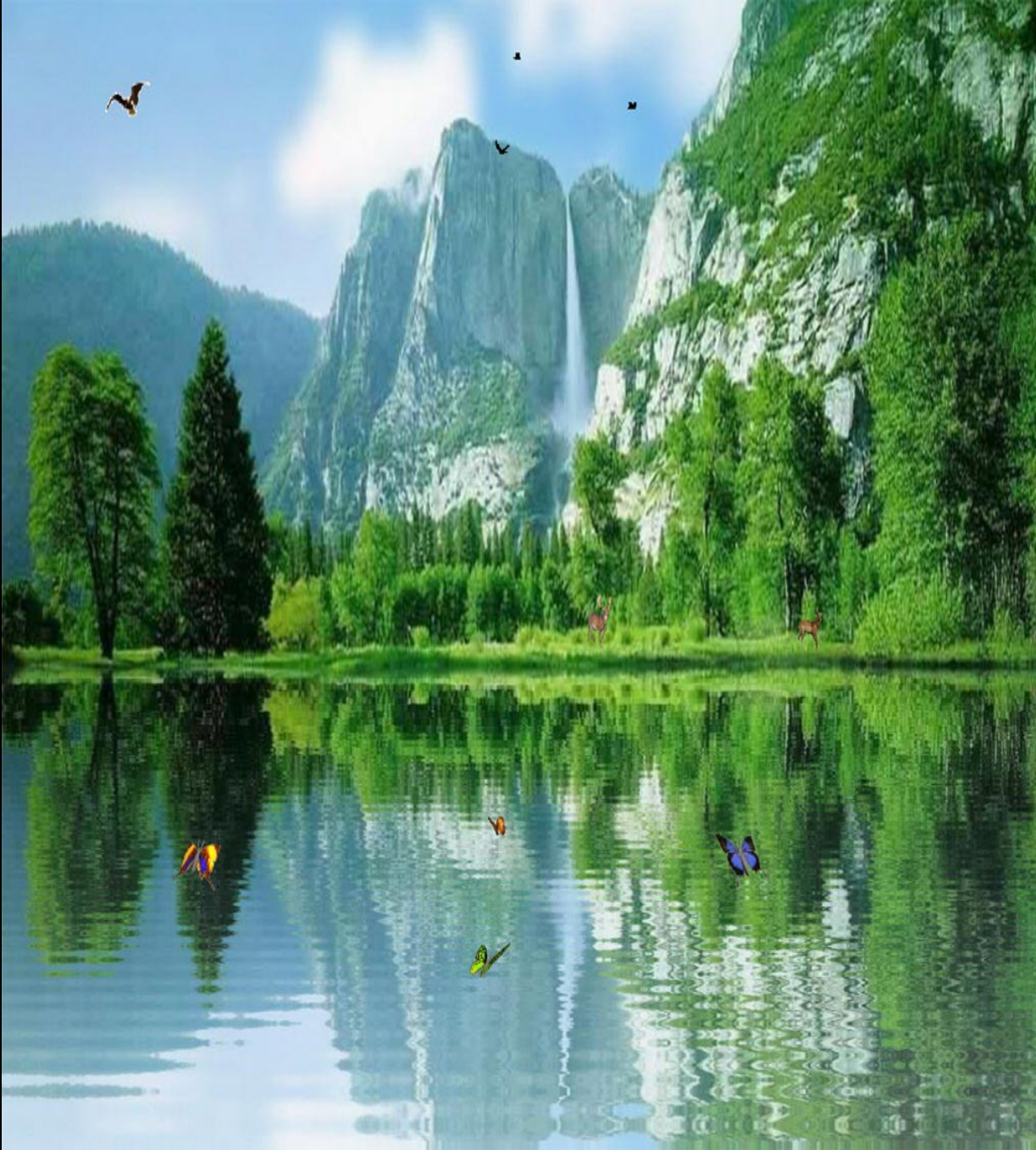
Galatians 2:10 They desired only that we should remember the poor, the very thing which I also was eager to do.

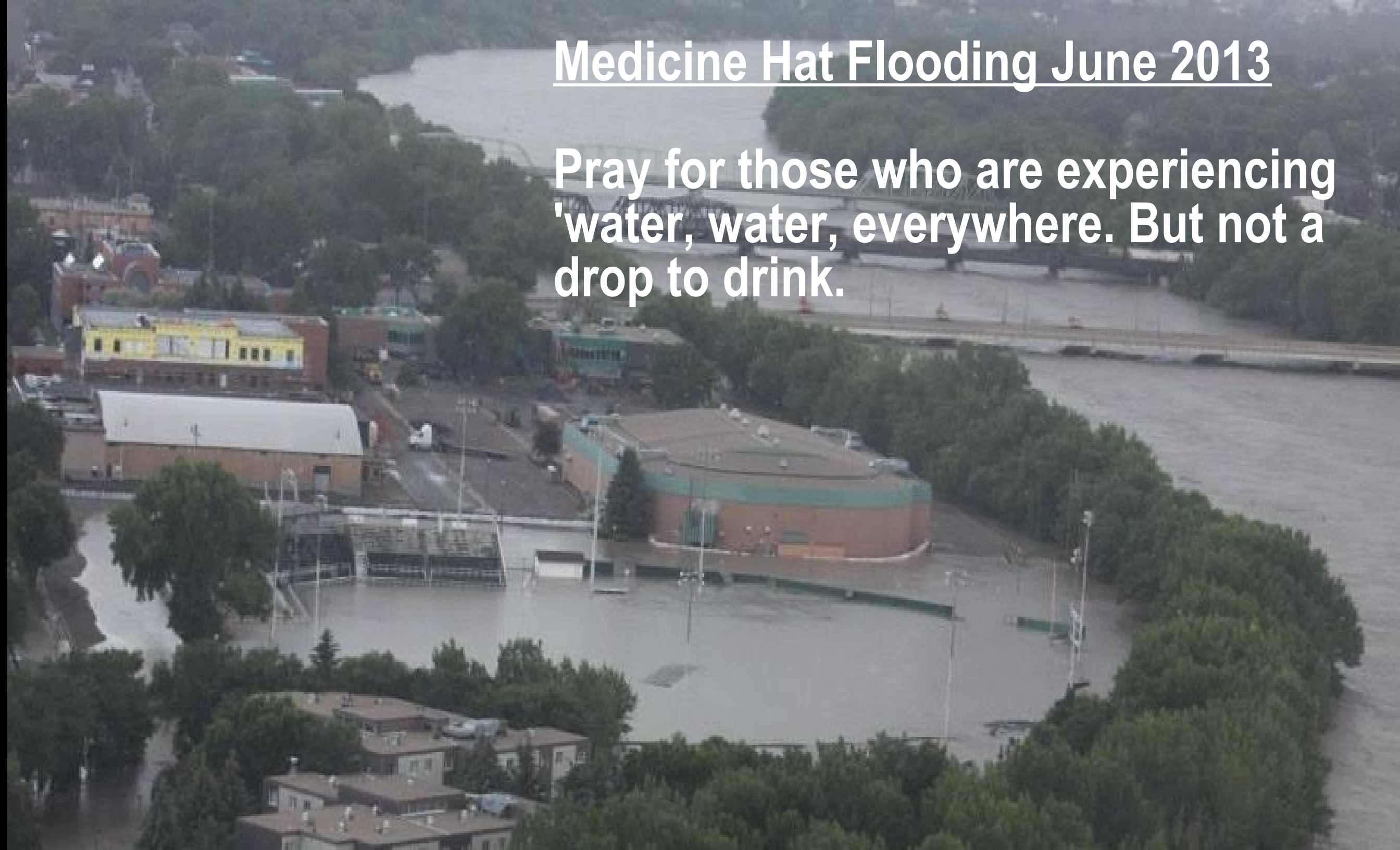
Thirsty and you gave me drink

Fresh water is critical to life on this planet.

While nearly 70 percent of the world is covered by water, only 2.5 percent of it is fresh. The rest is saline and ocean-based. Even then, just 1 percent of our freshwater is easily accessible, with much of it trapped in glaciers and snowfields. In essence, only 0.007 percent of the planet's water is available to fuel and feed its 6.8 billion people.

Pray for those who are experiencing 'water, water, everywhere. But not a drop to drink.





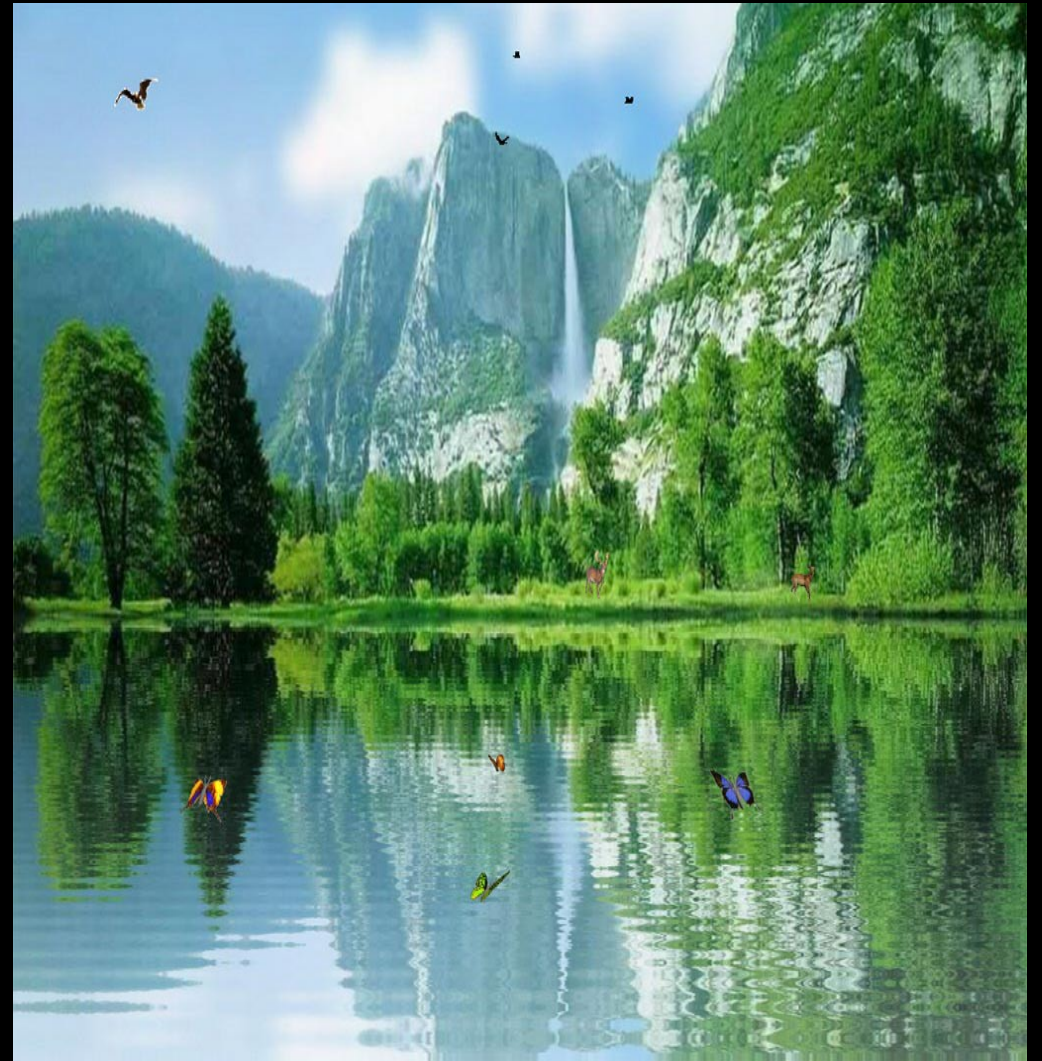
Floods triggered by heavy rains spread across north-western Bangladesh, marooning hundreds of thousands of people

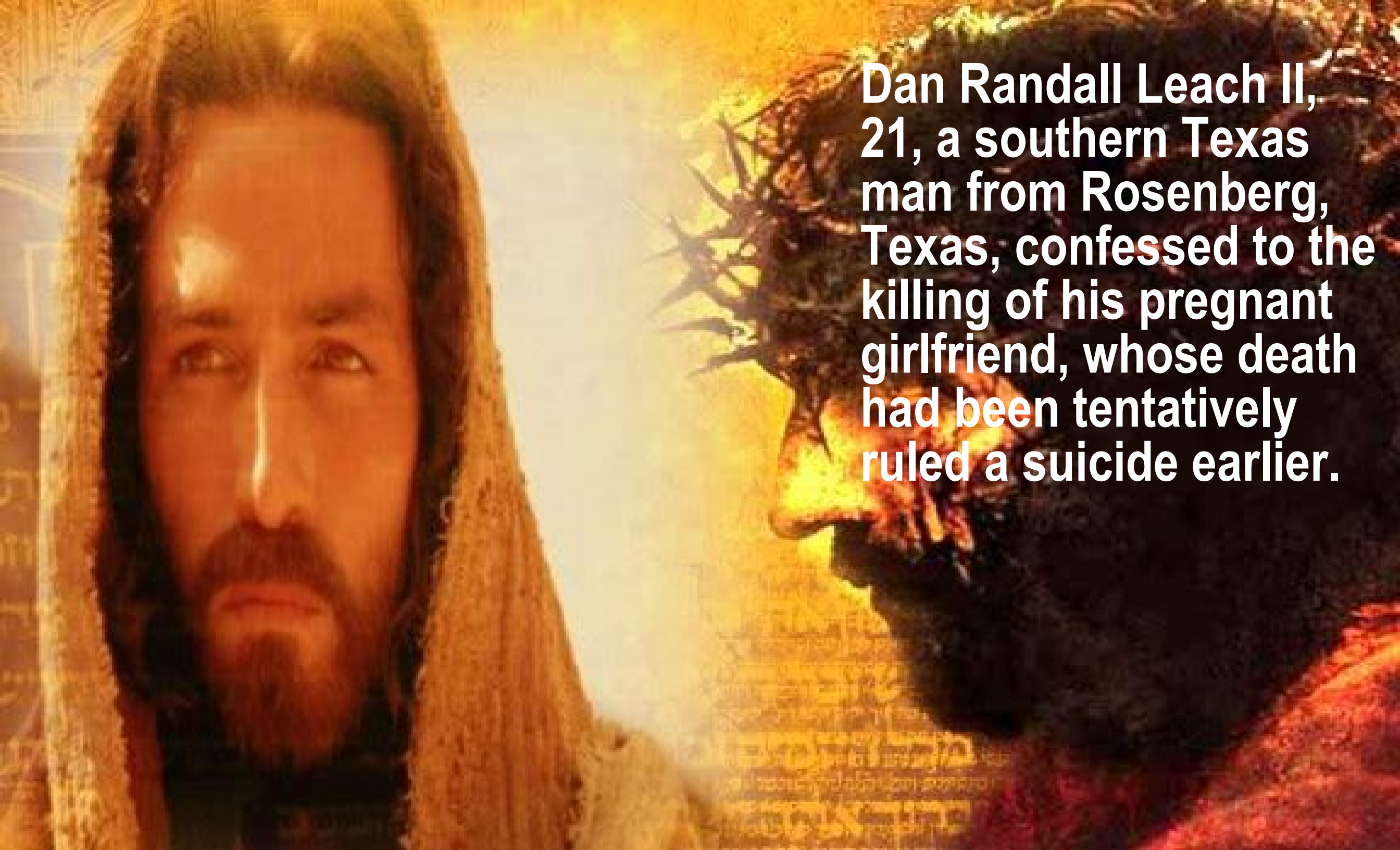
John 4:10 "If you knew the gift of God, and who it is who says to you, 'Give Me a drink,' you would have asked Him, and He would have given you living water."



The Substitutes “Goats” v. 41-46

Sin, according to world religions, is doing what is wrong or bad. The Chinese argue, “I have not killed people or set fires. How have I sinned?” According to the Bible, sin is not merely doing what is wrong, but also failing to do what is right or good. Sin is not merely a bad deed committed but a right thing omitted. Theologically, the practice of wrongdoing is the sin of commission, and the failure to do right is the sin of omission. James 4:17 “Anyone, then, who knows the good he ought to do and doesn’t do it, sins.”



There are 4 Main interpretations.**

View #1. “The least of these my brothers of Jesus is the National state of Modern day Israel.”

**(Romans 11:25 “And so all Israel will be saved”
Rev. 7- 12,000 sealed from each tribe)**



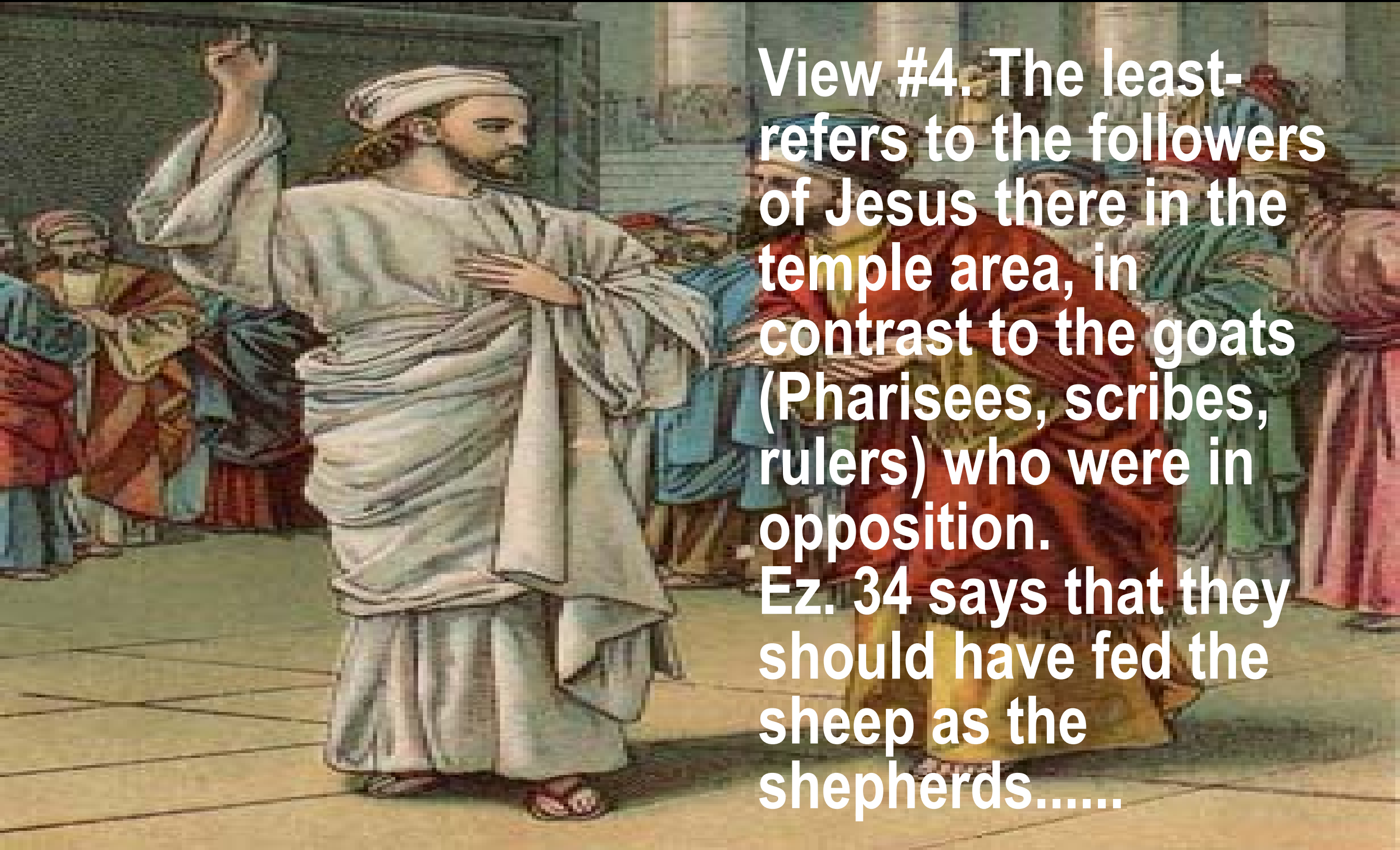
**View #2. “Mikros- the least, smallest,
little ones...**



View #2. “Mikros- the least, smallest, little ones....used of the least of cities (Mt. 2:6), least of commands, (Mt. 5:19), least of seeds (musterd...Mt. 13:32) of these it refers to the little ones (children) Mt. 18:6 “Whoso causes one of these little ones who believe in me to sin” , the infirm, the helpless. After telling the story of the Lost Sheep “it is not the will of the Father that one of these little ones should perish!” Mt. 18:14

View #3. The least- refers to any believer that is small, marginalized, sick, handicapped etc” Mt. 12:49, “And He stretched out his hand toward His disciples and said “Here is my mother and brothers! For whoever does the will of My Father in heaven, is my brother, sister and mother.” (see also Mr. 3:31-34, Lk. 8:19-21)





**View #4. The least-
refers to the followers
of Jesus there in the
temple area, in
contrast to the goats
(Pharisees, scribes,
rulers) who were in
opposition.
Ez. 34 says that they
should have fed the
sheep as the
shepherds.....**

'Thus says the Lord GOD to the shepherds: "Woe to the shepherds of Israel who feed themselves! Should not the shepherds feed the flocks?³ You eat the fat and clothe yourselves with the wool; you slaughter the fatlings, *but* you do not feed the flock.⁴ The weak you have not strengthened, nor have you healed those who were sick, nor bound up the broken, nor brought back what was driven away, nor sought what was lost; but with force and cruelty you have ruled them. Ez. 34:2-5

"I will seek what was lost and bring back what was driven away, bind up the broken and strengthen what was sick; but I will destroy the fat and the strong, and feed them in judgment." 17 'And *as for* you, O My flock, thus says the Lord GOD: "Behold, I shall judge between sheep and sheep, between rams and goats. (Ez. 34:16,17)

'The Departing Remarks from Jesus for the Goats-

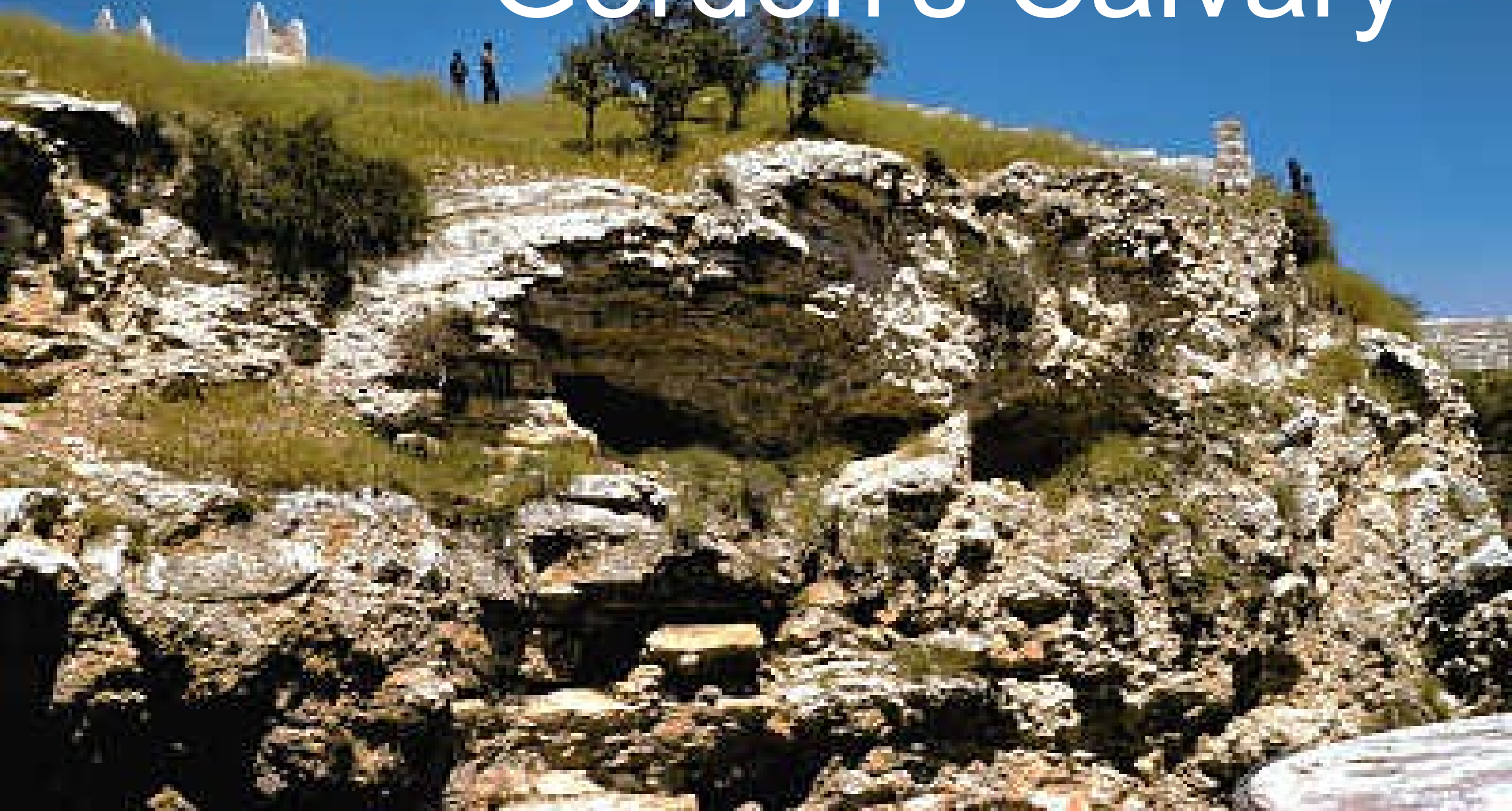
Depart from Me, you cursed, into the everlasting fire prepared for the devil and his angels:

And these will go away into everlasting punishment, but the righteous into eternal life." (Mt. 25:41, 46)



And I saw the dead, small and great, standing before God, and books were opened. And another book was opened, which is *the Book of Life*. And the dead were judged according to their works, by the things which were written in the books.¹³ The sea gave up the dead who were in it, and Death and Hades delivered up the dead who were in them. And they were judged, each one according to his works.¹⁴ Then Death and Hades were cast into the lake of fire. This is the second death. ¹⁵ And anyone not found written in the Book of Life was cast into the lake of fire. Rev. 20:12-15

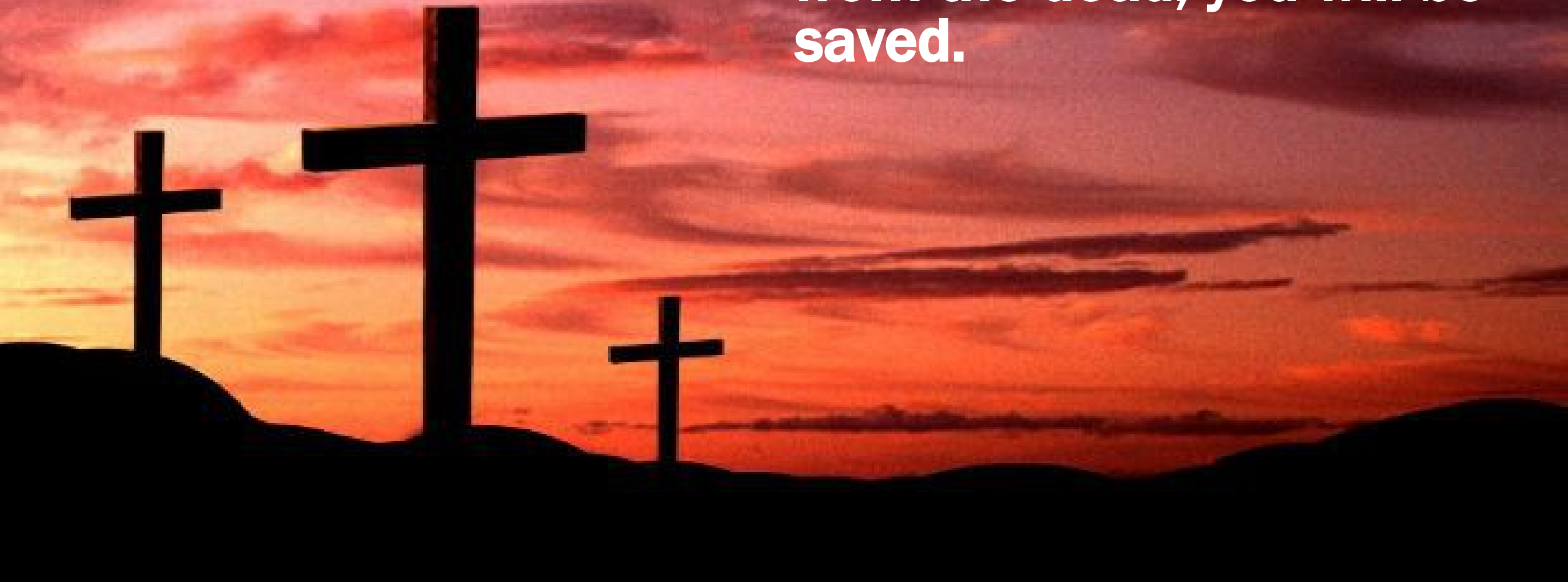


